Avery Dulles' Models of Church

Summarized by Carlus Gupton

- 1. **Church as Institution** emphasizes stability, tradition, and order as God's system for salvation and community on earth and as God's instrument for discovering, maintaining, and mediating truth.
- 2. **Church as Mystical Communion** stresses the role of the Spirit in creating a meaningful and spontaneous fellowship. A personal walk with God and the enhancement of relational side of Christian experience is the ultimate goal of this model.
- 3. Church as Sacrament celebrates the intersection between the human and divine.
- 4. **Church as Herald** puts the priority on proclaiming the good news. The church is most faithful when there is an abundance of evangelistic efforts.
- 5. **Church as Servant** seeks to touch the suffering world at the points of greatest need. The church is truest to its calling when it is feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, etc.
